- They will begin to use some of their print and letter knowledge to engage in early writing.
- They will write some or all of their name and begin to write some letters accurately.

Reception will be learning to (amongst other things):

- Understand how to listen carefully and why listening is important,
- Use new vocabulary,
- Ask questions to find out more and to check they understand what has been said to them,
- Articulate their ideas and thoughts in well-formed sentences,
- Connect one idea or action to another using a range of connectives,
- Describe events in some detail,
- Use talk to help work out problems and organise thinking and activities,
- Explain how things work and why they might happen,
- Develop social phrases,
- Engage in storytimes,
- Listen to and talk about stories to build familiarity and understanding,
- Retell the story, once they have developed a deep familiarity with the text; some as exact repetition and some in their own words,
- · Learn rhymes, poems and songs,
- Engage in non-fiction books.
- Listen to and talk about selected non-fiction to develop a deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary.
- Read individual letters by saying the sounds for them,
- Blend sounds into words, so that they can read short words made up of known letter- sound correspondences,
- Read some letter groups that each represent one sound and say sounds for them,
